Dear Gary:

I read a Cindy Adams column which was published in the New York Post on December 22, 2009 (the "Column") concerning the wedding of Kevin and Danielle Jonas at Oheka, wherein Ms. Adams stated, among other things, that she had been a guest at my wedding in July 2004 which also took place at Oheka and that by 10:45 p.m. that night had not received any dinner, causing her and other unidentified guests to leave. She concludes by stating that "[t]his must be the Oheka idea of lavish catering." To my knowledge this is simply false and untrue.

Contrary to the Column, Oheka did a fabulous job hosting and catering our 400+ person wedding. Neither Ms. Adams nor anyone else ever complained or said to me or my husband that the main course was not timely served nor did anyone say there wasn't more than enough food to eat nor that anyone had to leave before the main course was served. Simply stated, the food and service was outstanding and in all respects timely served per our instructions, from the lavish cocktail hour, through the main course, to the wonderful desserts. In fact, afterwards, many of our guests complimented us on what a wonderful time they had and particularly, how much they enjoyed the food and the excellent service.

The fact that the Column is false and untrue with regard to our wedding is further evidenced by Ms. Adam's column published in the New York Post dated July 19, 2004 ("July 2004 Column) right after she attended our wedding in July 2004. In the July 2004 Column while reporting on our wedding and her attendance, she notably made absolutely no mention of anything negative but rather was quite complementary and proclaimed what a "glitzy" and enjoyable time she had. Indeed in that July 2004 Column, Ms. Adams wrote glowingly: "**Charles and Camilla**-she should live so long-could not do it up glitzier. The reception was even in a castle, with courtiers trumpeting, rose petals strewn, musicians playing. Only thing different would be maybe **Queen Elizabeth's** guest list...The cake. A **Steven Spielberg**-style production. Six feet, five tiers high..." (Emphasis in original July 2004 Column). Notably not one negative mention is made about the service or the food only about what a lavish affair it was and indeed fitting for the Queen of England and Prince Charles!

To reiterate, neither I nor my husband have ever received any complaints whatsoever about our wedding at Oheka and none from Ms. Adams. No one ever complained that dinner wasn't timely served or that they had to go home hungry before it was served. We couldn't have asked for a more beautiful wedding and for that we will always be grateful to Oheka and you.
